## Leadership Conversation Guide – Open Your Eyes

### Main Idea

In this week's message, Pastor Chris shared Part 3 of our "Change Your World" series and encouraged us to open our eyes to the world around us so we can truly see people and fulfill the Great Commission. When we suffer from spiritual nearsightedness, we don't see people, and we cannot reach who we cannot see. When we do see people, we feel responsible for them and want to do something to meet their needs. Let's be conscious of the people who are around us, listen to them, have compassion on them, and give them what they need in grace and truth.

### Make It Practical

- Let's open our eyes to where they are. We need to connect before we correct.
- Let's open our eyes to who they are. We don't have to be like them, but we do have to like them.
- Let's open our eyes to what they need. We need to show people the same kind of love God showed us: Unconditional love.

### Talk About It

1. If God answered all of your prayers, would it change the world or just change you? How can we intentionally move our prayers from nearsighted to farsighted?
2. Pastor Chris said that sometimes we don't see right because we don't see God right. Do think God can't be reached, doesn't want you, or requires a lot from you? Or do you see God as a free gift? As a group, discuss which of these views feels most relatable to you and why. What is the truth?
3. Pastor Chris talked about our "spiritual spots," which are areas where we're most sensitive, and often need the most encouragement or help from others. In your sphere of influence, how can you foster an environment that allows people to share their "spiritual spot?"
