**Message Title:** One Step at a Time

**Key Text:** II Corinthians 3:16-18

## Discussion Guide

### Main Idea

This week, Pastor Mark Pettus kicked off the *This Changes Everything* series by focusing on what happens after salvation: discipleship. In II Corinthians 5:17, we are reminded that in Christ we are made new! The old is gone, the new has come. But this new life is not the end of the journey. It is just the beginning! Discipleship is the process of growing and becoming who God created us to be, maturing and reflecting the image of Christ (Ephesians 4:13).

Many of us feel pressure when we think about spiritual growth, but Pastor Mark reminded us that discipleship happens step by step. Just like a ship is filled piece by piece, so God forms us over time. We don't have to do everything at once, we just have to keep moving forward. Every step we take leads us to more of God's presence, freedom, and purpose.

In II Corinthians 3:16-18, we see the promise of discipleship. As we turn to the Lord, the veil is removed, giving us direct access to Him. Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. As we continue to follow Him, we begin to reflect His glory, becoming part of His mission to reach others.

No matter where you are in your journey, God has more for you. The question is not whether God wants to move in your life. The question is whether you're willing to take the next step.

### Make It Practical

1. Read Ephesians 4:13 and reflect on what it means to grow in Christ and become mature. What area of your life is God currently developing?
2. According to II Corinthians 3:17, freedom is found where the Spirit of the Lord is. Are there areas of your life where you are resisting God's boundaries instead of trusting Him?
3. As we grow, we begin to reflect who God is. Who in your life can you intentionally encourage or point toward Jesus this week?

## **Talk About It**

1. What do you think God may have been saying to you through this message?
